Students should study abroad in a country that speaks the second language they are learning. It is recommended that students study at an institution that offers a curriculum with language, culture, business, hospitality, and tourism courses. Students should coordinate this experience with NRRT, Foreign Languages and Literatures, and CSU study abroad advisors. By registering for SA 482 Study Abroad, students automatically satisfy the Global and Cultural Awareness category (3E) of the AUCC.</p>

Students seeking a minor or optional double major in Language must first declare their minor or major with the Department of Languages, Literatures and Cultures and meet with an advisor in that department.

To Complete a Minor in French, German, or Spanish

Minimum of 21 credits of French, German, or Spanish, at least 15 of which must be upper division, including at least one literature or civilization course and one course at the 400 level. Courses taught in English may not be used to meet requirements from the minor.

To Complete a Minor in Japanese or Chinese

Minimum of 21 credits in Japanese, at least 12 of which must be upper-division credits.

To Complete an Optional Double Major in Global Tourism and Languages, Literatures, and Cultures

Requirements: 24 additional upper-division credits in language, literature, and culture

All majors and minors in the department of Foreign Languages and Literatures must earn a minimum grade of C (a grade of C- is not acceptable) in each upper-division course that carries the L prefix.
