



NATURAL WONDER FINALISTS

1. 67 Degrees South (Maricela Alaniz)

In January 2023, I traveled to Antarctica on an expedition cruise. Born out of a desire to study abroad on the White Continent, but restricted by the pandemic year after year, I decided to travel solo to Antarctica during my gap year between university and grad school. Video will never truly capture the beauty of Antarctica, but I still had so much fun putting this together. Hope you enjoy!

2. The Election Day Earthquake (Ryan Connor)

After learning about the geological past of Colorado, I wanted to make a documentary that shows why Colorado is no stranger to geologic change. This led me to center this vid on the November 7th, 1882, earthquake of Colorado. With expert help from Associate Professor of Geology at CSU, Dr. Jerry MagLoughlin, the video explores how earthquakes happen and why Colorado is susceptible to really big ones.




6. Slow Growth (Chloe Miller)
